Midwest/Delta region: Detroit Mercy, Marquette, Regis, Rockhurst and Spring Hill West coast: Regis (depending how Regis wishes to locate itself ©) and University of San Francisco East coast: Fairfield, Fordham, LeMoyne, St. Joseph's, St. Peter's and Wheeling Jesuit

Election of conference officials/liaison and committee members:

 - AUSJAL-CATI-AJCU-CITM (3-4) which should serve as planning committee for ITESO meeting
 - AJCU-CITM survey project (3-4)
- (3) Please note that all positions are open for nominations. If you are interested in helping the cause then please let me know by e-mail before the end of Monday, April 8, 2002. Or if you feel called at the business meeting, then please rise to the occasion when we call for nominations.

Issues for discussion:

- (1) Planning for ITESO meeting in 2003.
- (2) Adobe Academic Consortium Application. With the assistance of persons from six or seven AJCU institutions, Mark Castner (Canisius) has been working with Adobe, Inc. to develop a consortium agreement for the AJCU colleges and universities for the purchase of Adobe software products. Mark should be commended for his effort here. We have been talking for years about using the purchase power as a consortium. Perhaps, this will be the project that will succeed. Dick Vigilante, Executive Director of JesuitNET, is prepared to sign the consortium agreement on behalf of the AJCU if our group votes in favor of the agreement. By the way, the AJCU does have a consortium agreement with WebCT.

(3) AJCU-CITM infrastructure survey. Joel Cohen (Canisius) has headed this initiative for the past few implementations. Charlie Leonhardt (Georgetown) put some of the results online for Intranet access. The question arises – should we do the survey again. If so, how, when, by whom. Certainly, we can revisit the issue of putting the survey online. We have money in our conference budget.

Let the member institutions complete (and update their responses) the survey online. Then the issue of who gets to see what. One option is to permit all AJCU-CITM members to view aggregated results and limit the display of the results to those member institutions that actually completed the survey.
