Hailing from the hayseed neighborhood of Bernal Heights in San Francisco, the Bean Hollow Duo stokes the fires of the Appalachian music tradition to give you a glimpse of the past through the eyes of the present, with voice, fiddles, mandolin, guitar and banjo.

12:00 p.m. – Emmanuel Gomez, Staff Gardener from SF Recreation and Parks Department, will share gardening tips for people who are blind or have visual impairments, and will also speak about the San Francisco Botanical Garden's Garden of Fragrance, Golden Gate Park's own sensory garden, which boasts the most pleasant and unique smelling plants from around the world.

1:30 p.m. - Robert Reed, Recology spokesperson, will talk about San Francisco's employee owned recycling and compost collection company.
